

FAST FACTS

- ► LAS is owned and operated by the Clark County Department of Aviation (CCDOA). CCDOA operates as a business enterprise fund; the airport does not receive any tax revenue from Clark County or the State of Nevada.
- ► The airport is conveniently located just two miles from the world-famous Las Vegas Strip, with the majority of hotels located within a 15-minute drive from the airport.
- ► LAS covers 2,800 acres with two separate terminal buildings. Each has its own parking garage, ticketing/checkin lobby, baggage claim, shuttle stops, Lyft/Uber and taxi pickup areas, shops, and restaurants. The buildings house a combined 109 aircraft gates and are connected by an automated tram system.
- ▶ There are two sets of pararellel runways (8/26 Left & Right and 1/19 Left & Right) for a total of four. LAS has eight miles of runways and 24 miles of taxiways.
- ▶ At more than 14,500 feet, Runway 8L-26R is the secondlongest commercial runway in North America.
- ▶ The airport rental car center houses 10 car rental companies and is open 24/7 with continuous shuttle service to and from the airport terminals.
- ▶ There are 16,000 public parking spaces across two garages and three surface lots.
